Oceans

The ocean is an amazing part of our planet. There are many parts to the ocean and many different types of animals that call it home.

Coral reefs give food and shelter to small animals that live near the top of the ocean. Coral reefs are warm and usually have lots of light. Starfish, sea anemones, and clams live here.

The seashore is the part of the ocean that most of us know the best.

There is the sand on the beach, but there are also tide pools along the rocks.

Animals that live on the rocks have arms and legs that help them hold onto the rocks when the waves crash on them. Some small animals will dig holes into the sand when the waves start coming in.

Many sea animals live in the open ocean where there is still some light. Many types of plants, as well as sharks, fish, turtles, and seals live here.

Deep down in the ocean there is very little light. It is also very cold. In the deepest parts of the ocean, it is totally dark. Some animals that live down there have to create their own light to attract fish for them to eat.
